Margarita McGrath is a co-founder of noroof, a Brooklynbased architecture practice, an associate professor and chair of the undergraduate architecture program at Virginia Tech.

Designing the super small vs the super tall has garnered national and worldwide attention for **noroof** architects. **noroof**'s first project, a 'refined and rigorous little house house,' won an AIA National Housing Award in 2008, and an AIA National Small Practice Practitioner's Award (2008). Subsequent work has been recognized by AIA New York Chapter design awards (2007, 2009), AIA Brooklyn + Queens (2016), Residential Architecture (2011), Building Brooklyn (2007, 2018), and numerous design anthologies.

Margarita's work at Virginia Tech allows her to collaborate with students on larger scale projects like a post-autonomous car national touring infrastructure, civic towers, and affordable live-work artist housing. Collaborative sponsored research includes work on smART infrastructure and applying studio learning to STEM curriculum. A series of "ghost projects" explore the intangible connections between architecture, material culture, and memory. These initiatives seek novel approaches to cultivating contemporary cultural environments.

Margarita has lectured, workshopped, and been a visiting critic in the US and abroad, working and teaching in Vienna and Seoul during the first decade of her career. Current work at **noroof** includes "Land Ho!" a research project funded by a Brunner Grant, a gender equity center feasiblity study, and noroof's first project with a new foundation. Margarita is also writing and giving lectures about the effects of early computer games and Adobe graphics software on design. During COVID, she was selected as one of a new shift of academic leaders who will play a role in enabling us to break free from our current social and environmental impasse.
